R Kernel

- System commands are not executed as in Python kernel, but system function in R will be a substitute.
 - In Python: !ls –l
 In R: system("ls –l", intern=T)
- You cannot mount my drive as you can in Python.
- When you use "%load_ext rpy2.ipython" to run R, you cannot use keras package because of some unknown interferences between the modules. You can evaluate a few functions when keras is introduced, but you will encounter an error message shortly.

Mounting "my Drive"

- In Python kernel, you can mount your my Drive by
 from google.colab import drive drive.mount('/content/drive')
- But I could not find how we could do to get equivalent results in R.

FC vs. Conv.



The quantity represented by each unit in the previous layer is supposed to be independent from the other units in the

layer

Mutually dependent

The quantity represented by each unit in the previous layer is supposed to be closely related to its "neighboring" units and the relation is invariant to the positions. Image and time-series are full-fledged for the inputs.

FC vs. Conv.+FC

- Often (but not always) output units require a combination of quantities not related each other
 → full connected layers for output-side
- Input quantities are spatially or sequentially related → convolutional layers for input-side



Pooling layers

FIGURE 2. 5- and C-

- A type of layer to reduce the size of previous layers.
- E.g. 256x256 to 64x64 by combining 2x2 units to 1
- Used for obtaining units to look around wider area
